


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In John 4:35, Jesus says: "I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." I recently bicycled out to the edge of the Meadows section of Dakota Dunes, where I hadn't been for a few months. I was very surprised not only by the new houses, but entire new streets, full of houses, that hadn't been there just a few months before.

If you go out to where the streets end in the Meadows, or the Prairie, where my family lives, or also Wyndstone and areas of McCook Lake and North Sioux City, you look out onto large, open fields. But, if you look closely, in those fields you will often see survey stakes, trenches being dug, utilities being laid, and streets and lots being platted.

When Holy Cross was started ten years ago, most of this area was fields, of soybeans and other crops. Now, in many places in the communities our congregation serves, there is a new crop: "I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest."

Our church is surrounded by fields ripe for harvest! That is purpose of the Christian Church; that is the purpose of our congregation; to bring in God's harvest, by proclaiming the Gospel. I'd like you to think of our proposed building expansion as a *planter* and a *combine*; a planter, to help us as we plant the Gospel in these communities; and a combine, for harvesting souls, for God.

Jesus also said, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field" (Matthew 9:37-38). The fields surrounding our church are ripe, and we

are God's harvesters. The Lord's spiritual harvest at Holy Cross Lutheran Church has only just begun, and our proposed building expansion is for a *bigger, better planter*, and a *bigger, better combine*, to help us bring God's harvest in! "I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest."

Building for the Future

Fundraising Campaign Report

At the special congregational meeting on June 15, the Building Committee reported total pledges from our fundraising campaign, "Building for the Future," of between \$1.1-\$1.2 million. This is a very successful result for a congregation of our size!

By comparison, the largest Lutheran congregation in Sioux City, with over 3,800 members, recently had a building campaign with a goal of \$4.5 million, but they also raised approximately \$1.2 million. Similarly, a community church in Sioux City with over 1,000 members recently had a building campaign with a goal of \$2.7 million. They likewise raised approximately \$1.2 million—which seems to be the magic number for church building projects in Sioux City this year! Holy Cross is still considered a mission congregation, so for our congregation to nearly match these much larger, older and more established churches is extraordinary.

For our fundraising phase, the Building Committee thought it was best to present a global proposal, including all the components for possible expansion. As previously planned, we are now assessing the feasibility and scope of the project based upon our financial resources.

At the meeting on June 15 the committee discussed various options with those present and will now take additional time to study these options before seeking congregational approval for construction. This will set back our timetable several months. However, that should not be to our disadvantage, and could even be to our advantage, since the bids would be solicited at a slower time in the construction industry.

As we continue to move forward with this process, we praise and thank God for the generous pledges received.



Vacation Bible School Big Success!

Over 50 children attended VBS at Holy Cross, most of them non-member children from the community.

Each child received as a gift from Holy Cross five high-quality Arch books, for each of the five Bible stories covered. The children also enjoyed high quality crafts, an excellent music program, snacks and recess.

In their daily offerings the children gave over \$1,300 to buy school supplies for children in the Kibera Lutheran Preschool in Nairobi, Kenya, which Pastor Vogts visited on his mission trip to Kenya last year.

Kibera is the slum area of Nairobi, considered one of the worst slums in the world, which Pastor Vogts also toured. The poverty and living conditions are unimaginable. Several hundred children are blessed to attend the preschool operated by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya adjacent to the slum. It provides them with critical early childhood education and structure in their often disordered lives. Most of all, they are brought to Jesus as he commanded, "Let the little children come unto Me" (Matthew 19:14).


FIVE FAVORITE STORIES FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT







We had a great New Year and Easter Celebration at the Child Rescue Orphanage in Krang Lovea where our Lutheran youth shared the Good News of Christ's resurrection with the children. Their program opened with a welcome and prayer, followed by three dances and Christian songs. It was really special to see our youth perform with such confidence. Then one of the youth gave the "Easter Message of Hope." He normally is a very quiet young man, but when he speaks the Word he becomes very animated and draws everyone's attention. Even non-Christians stop and listen. One of the joys of the day, was after he finished speaking, he was sitting with the people who were attending from the village, and seemed to hold them spellbound, as he shared the Easter story and the salvation that Christ gave us from the cross! Even when the food was being served they waited to hear the rest of his story. After lunch, he worked with the young children and casually talked at length to the older boys. What an amazing young man! He is about 22 years old, and though he is not a Pastor he is a fine young man of God. He does not attend a Bible college, but a regular university. We firmly believe that someday, if God so wills, he will share the Easter story throughout Cambodia!

We also recently witnessed more than 164 souls baptized into God's family. As I watched, a vision of John the Baptist and our Lord Jesus floated through my mind and it was a very emotional time, as well, as very beautiful. It certainly was a strong reminder of how God is working in His Kingdom, here in Cambodia. Statistics show that only 2 percent of the population is Christian in this country. Six months ago it was 1 percent! The Holy Spirit marches forward to spread God's Word and Hope in Christ our Savior.
