

2006 was a year of change for churches in the communities our congregation serves. Of the eight Christian churches in Dakota Dunes, North Sioux City and McCook Lake, three—one-third—either closed permanently, or began operations under a new name in 2006.

Taking a broader look at Lutheran churches across Siouxland, statistics available on the web sites of our own Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (www.lcms.org) and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (www.elca.org) show that in 2006 almost all Lutheran churches in Siouxland reported decreases or a plateau in most categories.

Psalm 115:1 says, "Not to us, not to us, O LORD, but to Your name be the glory, because of Your love and faithfulness." We give God glory for His many blessings to Holy Cross in 2006. Most importantly, the faithful blessings of His love and grace distributed to us each week in worship through his Word and Sacrament.

We also rejoice that under His blessing we experienced increases in membership, attendance and giving. Perhaps most remarkable is our successful "Building for the Future" fundraising campaign and our decision

to proceed with a sanctuary addition. As we enter 2007, we pray that in His love and faithfulness He continues to shower down His blessings upon us, both individually and as a congregation.

Significant challenges for our congregation in 2007 and beyond include: members who have been absent from worship; low and irregular attendance at Sunday School and Bible Class; and increasing offerings at the pace necessary to offset both our declining mission subsidy and the increased operating expenses to be expected from our expanded facilities.

Sadly, Gethsemane Lutheran Church in North Sioux City, the only other Lutheran congregation in the Dakota Dunes, North Sioux City, McCook Lake communities, closed in 2006, reportedly after a controversy within the congregation. This was even more surprising because it happened just as they were completing an ambitious building project for a beautiful new sanctuary. You may have noticed their empty building on River Drive in North Sioux City, sad and forlorn, with the doors literally boarded shut.

This sad example is a warning for us. For it shows that such a project can deteriorate, from being inspiring and unifying, to being a source of conflict and division. That is probably our biggest challenge as a congregation in 2007. To remember *why*, for what purpose, and for whom we are building a new sanctuary in the first place. "Not to us, not to us, 0 Lord, but to Your name be the glory, because of Your love and faithfulness."

In Ephesians 4:16, St. Paul gives us the formula for completing our own ambitious building project with a happier and more God-pleasing outcome: "lurge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit— just as you were called to one hope when you were called—one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."

Building for the Future

Building Project Update

Our building project was submitted to contractors for competitive bids in mid-January. Their bids are due back to us in mid-February.

As the project has proceeded over the past several months, from the concept to more detailed plans, the Building Committee has been exicted to see unfolding what will be an exceptionally beautiful and unique sanctuary. It will be a glorious temple to our Lord and a noted landmark in our community.

Lord willing, one or more of the bids will be within our overall budget of approximately \$1.5 million, which also includes other items not part of the bid, such as furnishings and architect fees. If none of the bids is within budget, the Building Committee will need to make adjustments to the project, and/or the congregation will need to provide further funding.

After any such final adjustments which may be necessary have been addressed and a contractor selected,

the congregation will have a final vote to proceed with the project and approve any borrowing. Groundbreaking could take place early this spring, with construction proceeding over the summer and fall.

We should be able to continue using our current facilities for worship, preschool, and other activities with minimal interruption during the construction process.



Record Attendance Christmas Eve

For our Christmas Eve services we had a record 127 worshippers, 81 at the 7:00pm Family Service and 46 at the 11:30pm "Midnight Mass." About two-thirds of those attending were visitors from the community.

One young visitor commented, as he was leaving the "Midnight Mass" with a large group of college age friends, "Thanks so much for arranging all this." Another couple said they had searched the Internet for a church with a midnight service. And, of course, many visitors

L.I.F.E. Lutheran Initiative For Fducation

In September of 2005 two individuals from each LCMS congregation in Sioux City met together for the purpose of writing a constitution that would form an affiliation of the congregations for the purpose of supporting a Lutheran parochial school in Sioux City in the future. The constitution was completed in October of 2006. The pastor in each LCMS congregation will receive a copy of this constitution in January 2007.

The next step in the process will be to identify two individuals in each congregation to serve on an interim Board of Directors. This Board will write the By-Laws of the school (how the school will be organized). They will put together a proposal to identify a facility to use and the costs of purchasing and maintaining the facility for the purpose of the school. Lastly the Board of Directors will formulate an assessment equation by which congregations in the Affiliation will pay for the school.

Once the three tasks of this interim Board of Directors are completed the entire package will be brought to each LCMS congregation in the area to read and discuss. Information meetings will be held so all interested individuals will have the information they need to vote for their congregation to join the Affiliation or not to join the Affiliation.

Concordia: The Lutheran Confessions Backorder Arrives

Last year about two dozen members signed up to purchase copies of our Synod's new edition of the Book of Concord, containing the confessional statements of the Lutheran Church. This updated English translation was issued for the 425th anniversary of the original publication of the Book of Concord in 1580.

However, because of unexpectedly high demand—it actually became one of the best selling

books in the Christian publishing industry last year—the first printing ran out before our order could be fulfilled, and due to production delays they have been on back order since. We have just received our copies of the second printing!
