Pastor's Annual Report



This is an adaptation of the Pastor's Annual Report for 2011 that I presented at the Annual Meeting of the Voters Assembly on January 15, 2012.

Obviously, 2011 was a very unusual and difficult year for Holy Cross. It is extraordinary for a congregation, with virtually no advance notice, to completely evacuate its building for nearly four months, and instead of holding its own services to worship jointly for that length of time with another congregation.

Because people tend to relocate over the summer, that is usually the time each year when we receive most of our new members. Obviously, there weren't too many people moving into Dakota Dunes last summer! And, with our building evacuated and services being held elsewhere, we were not in a position to draw potential new members.

Although the level of Holy Cross members worshipping over the summer at Concordia Lutheran Church was quite good considering the circumstances, all this has had an impact on our levels of membership and attendance. These unforeseen events also caused many other changes in our plans, such as cancellation of Vacation Bible School and our Saturday Summer Services, and postponement of projects originally


scheduled for the summer, including redecorating the Fellowship Hall and completing installation of our new pipe organ.

On the positive side, I want to express my deep thanks to all the Holy Cross members who worked so hard and so well together despite these extremely challenging circumstances. Also, a great joy for me during this difficult time was that most members of Holy Cross were able to be present for my 25th Ordination Anniversary service and banquet on August 14, and the exceptional love and generosity that you showed to me with this event. My special thanks to the anniversary committee for arranging the extraordinary honor of having my friends LCMS President Matthew Harrison and Kenyan Archbishop Walter Obare present for the occasion.

Other highlights for me and positive developments for the congregation despite the negative conditions last year were the reception of over a dozen new members; I enjoyed researching and publishing a Lenten devotional booklet with excerpts from the writings of Martin Luther; the much needed revision of our Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, which should improve the functioning of our congregation; installation of new cabinets in our Church Office, which will greatly aid office operations; the installation, and dedication as part of Bob Barnum's funeral, of the beautiful new Creation window in our Sanctuary; the forthcoming dedication of our new pipe organ; nearly doubling the size of our choir and increasing both the frequency of our performances and level of our repertoire; our very successful new Advent suppers, and high attendance at Advent services, averaging 56; and increased combined attendance at our Christmas Eve services, 165 versus 142 in 2010.

A verse I often relied upon over the summer was Jeremiah 29:11: *"For I know the plans that I have for you," declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'*" I give thanks to God for seeing us through the tough times of 2011, and pray for His blessing upon us and our congregation in 2012.

Revised Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws Adopted

Our congregation's revised Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws were approved by the Annual Meeting of the Voters Assembly on January 15. Copies of these new governing documents are available on the table in the Gathering Room. They immediately go into effect provisionally, pending review by the State of South Dakota and the Constitution Committee of the LCMS South Dakota District.

Major features include the newly established positions of Vice-President and Board of Stewardship Chair, and a newly established Church Council, to help improve communication and coordination of our congregation's work. Our new Church Council, consisting of all church officers and board chairs, will have its first meeting on Thursday, February 16 at 7:00pm.



Pipe Organ Update

Our new pipe organ was installed in our balcony by Dobson Pipe Organ Builders during the first week of May. Tuning and voicing was scheduled for the first week of June—the very week the church was evacuated due to the flood. This work was therefore postponed and finally completed the week of January 8, making the new organ now ready for use.

A committee consisting of Melissa Jensen, Ron Yockey, and Pastor Vogts is tentatively planning the formal dedication and a dedicatory recital for April and/or May, depending upon the availability of possible guest organists and recitalists. However, we will gradually transition to using the new organ in our services during February and March. Because it is a very complicated mechanical device, with over 800 individual pipes and tens of thousands of moving parts, this “test run” allows any remaining issues to be discovered and corrected before the formal dedication.

A lot of work was done in the balcony to prepare it for the new organ: stiffening the floor joists and putting sound insulation in the floor; laying oak flooring; replacing the glass railing with matching wooden spindles; installing a new door to the storage room behind the organ; adding electrical service; and installing a new shelf above and behind the pipe organ for the speakers of our existing electronic organ (which we are keeping as a backup) and moving the speakers. A few items remain such as installing baseboards and stairs to the storage room and adjusting the balcony lighting. Though this complicated project was delayed due to the flood it has otherwise gone very smoothly and the work has been done mostly by our own members. Our thanks to all those who have helped over the past year with this big project!

A Statement on Recent HHS Decision and Religious Freedom

Many members of Holy Cross have inquired about what effect changes in health care regulations related to churches, much reported and discussed in the news lately, will have on our church body. On February 3 the Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, President of our denomination, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, released this statement.

We are deeply distressed by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) recent decision to require nearly all private health plans, including those offered by religious employers, to cover contraceptives. This will include controversial birth-control products such as "Ella" and the "morning after" pill, even though the Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) warns that such drugs can cause the death of a baby developing in the womb. The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) objects to the use of

drugs and procedures that are used to take the lives of unborn children, who are persons in the sight of God from the time of conception, and we are opposed to the HHS' decision mandating the coverage of such contraceptives.

This HHS action relates to a provision in the "health care reform" legislation (the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act) signed into law in 2010. The church's benefits partner, Concordia Plan Services, which provides health care coverage to nearly 48,000 people, has been actively monitoring this legislation and, as a result, Concordia Health Plan (CHP)—the LCMS church workers' health plan—has been maintained as a "grandfathered" plan. As such, employers and workers participating in CHP would not be subjected to the mandate. However, many religious organizations do not have grandfathered plans and cannot avail themselves of the extremely narrow religious-employer exemption, which only is applicable to religious employers that primarily serve and employ members of that faith.

For centuries, Lutherans have joyfully delivered Christ's mercy to others and embraced His call to care for the needy within our communities and around the world. In a nation that has allowed more than 54 million legal abortions since 1973, we must consider the marginalization of unborn babies and object to this mandate.

In addition, I encourage the members of the LCMS to join with me in supporting efforts to preserve our essential right to exercise our religious beliefs. This action by HHS will have the effect of forcing many religious organizations to choose between following the letter of the law and operating within the framework of their religious tenets. We add our voice to the long list of those championing for the continued ability to act according to the dictates of their faith, and provide compassionate care and clear Christian witness to society's most vulnerable, without being discriminated against by government.

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, a church body of sinners

redeemed by the blood of Jesus, has affected the lives of millions of people with care, aid, housing, health care, spiritual care and much more. We have been a force for good in this nation, promoting education (the nation's largest Protestant school system), marriage and giving people the tools and assistance to be good citizens. We live and breathe Romans 13:3-7. The governing authorities are "God's servant for good." We pray constantly for our President and those in authority. We have sent our sons and daughters to fight for this country. We have provided military chaplains, elected officials, officers, including some who have held the highest military offices and other appointed positions in this country. Our people have and are serving as congressmen and women and senators.

Increasingly we are suffering overzealous government intrusions into what is the realm of traditional and biblical Christian conscience. We believe this is a violation of our First Amendment rights. We will stand, to the best of our ability, with all religious and other concerned citizens, against this erosion of our civil liberty. Come what may, we shall do everything we can, by God's grace, to "obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29).



LCMS Pastor's Family in Tragic Accident

"A lot of hearts are broken" at Christ the King Lutheran Church, Salina, Kansas, and in other LCMS communities after the tragic car accident January 28 that killed the wife and two young children of the congregation's newly installed pastor, Rev. Jeffrey Geske.

Geske had served the Salina congregation less than two months, but already "many people had fallen in love with the family and are devastated," said Dennis Hill, Christ the King's lay minister, speaking of the deaths of Laura Geske, 37, and children Joshua, 8, and Joy, 3.

Pastor Geske was traveling with his family on I-70 near Topeka when another vehicle crossed the grass median and hit the Geske minivan head-on. Laura and the two children were pronounced dead at the scene. Pastor Geske and another son, Jacob, 3, were hospitalized for several days for injuries they sustained.

Geske got "lots of calls and emails from all over," Hill said, including from former parishes and communities where the couple has touched lives. Because Christ the King is a newer congregation with a smaller building the funeral was held February 4 at Faith Lutheran Church, Topeka, with burial in the family plot of Laura Geske at Bethlehem Lutheran Cemetery, Paxico, Kansas.

Before moving to Kansas, Geske served as pastor at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church for five years and Laura taught at Eastridge Elementary School, both in Amarillo, Texas. Dawn Danner, secretary at Prince of Peace, remembers Laura Geske as a dedicated teacher and, as the mother of twins Joy and Jacob, a proud member of Mothers of Multiples. "Laura was very quiet until you got to know her, and then she was very talkative and very humorous. She always had the right thing to say," Danner said.

The Geskes met as students at Concordia University, Seward, Nebraska. Laura taught at Topeka Lutheran School from 2000 to 2006 while her husband served his first congregation, Trinity Lutheran School, McFarland, Kansas.

The day after the accident, Hill had the difficult task of preaching for Pastor Geske at his grieving congregation. His sermon focused on Romans 8:38-39, about how nothing, not even such terrible tragedies or death itself, can separate Christians from the love of God in Christ.


